In Dr Seuss's classic Christmas tale, *How the Grinch Stole Christmas*, the Grinch suffers from having a small heart. The source of his problem is his lack of understanding of the meaning of Christmas. As the story goes, the Grinch tries to put a stop to Christmas, but in the end, he comes to understand what Christmas is all about and his heart grows three sizes! This makes a big difference in his life.

I'm not sure what Dr Seuss's intentions were when he wrote the story back in 1957, but it certainly comes across as a Christian parable that parallels the change that takes place in a person's life when he or she comes to understand the true meaning of Christmas: the birth of Jesus, God's Son, who was born to save His people from their sins (Matthew 1:21).

When the Good News of Jesus dawns upon a person, God replaces the old heart of stone with a new heart – and a new person emerges. As the Apostle Paul wrote, 'If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation, the old has gone, the new has

come!' (2 Corinthians 5:17). We celebrate Christmas because of the power Jesus has brought to change our hearts!

WHAT'S YOUR STORY?

I'd had a great day canoeing the Wye rapids with my brother and nephew. The waves had swamped our boat, so we'd been for an unexpected swim, but I had a strong sense that we were safe in God's hands.

Driving back home I was thinking about finding wild fruit for making wine and preserves. North of Stratford I felt God leading me to turn into a country lane, but my search for fruit seemed to be in vain. Then I felt God clearly telling me to stop 50 yards from the junction – opposite was a tree covered with apples. Not only that, it was on public land!

But the fruit wasn't ripe, so two months later, en route to my parent's house, we went to see if the apples were still there. Amazingly they were – despite the fact that the road was well used and the tree would have been passed by many people – so we picked them. I've made most of the fruit into a delicious chutney to keep or to give away and have been eating the rest as they've ripened.



The science I love and teach has no explanation for this experience. Science is a good servant to be respected, but the Lord is the master. Hearing a voice in your head may or may not be God speaking – we can only know that God was intervening in a supernatural way by the fruits and blessings that come from such experiences. In response, we give the glory to Him.

OUTREACH

The exhaust and catalytic converter on the new Mercedes van was stolen last night by thieves who broke into the Hope Centre car park. In the



aftermath of this we have had to deal with lengthy phone calls to insurers and van repairers. But what upsets me most is the fact that a vehicle used by the community to support the community has been targeted by one or two selfish individuals.

Isaiah 54 reminds us that we are called to inhabit desolate places and none more so than our new Foodbank distribution point in Stoke Aldermoor (see picture below). Several years after St Catherine's Church was forced to abandon its building because of escalating repair costs, the re-establishment of a physical presence of church in that community has been made by Coventry Foodbank, and the twenty-foot shipping container will start to distribute food in the New Year.



It also represents an ever growing network of relationships between churches across the city who have been moved by the Holy Spirit to stand in the gap in their local community. The change is subtle yet relentless, exciting and yet overwhelming. With Hope 14 a month away, God's timing in waking up the sleeping giant that is His church in His city is perfect.

Over 31,000 people fed, fourteen churches distributing food, 300 organisations signposting people to us and four Job Clubs started, so in the scheme of this, a stolen catalytic convertor is just a distraction and an irrelevance in furthering His Kingdom.
